She rejoins the New Museum on September 4 as a member of the senior management team, with over twenty years of experience in strategic planning, development, and team leadership.

Phillips said, "We welcome Regan back during this exciting period of growth for the New Museum, as we prepare to expand our facility and unveil the design this fall. Regan's passion for the Museum and experience in steering transformational projects makes her an ideal addition to our senior team. Our exhibitions abroad and lateral programs like IdeasCity, Rhizome's Seven on Seven, and NEW INC have extended our reach and impact—made possible largely through the power of collaboration and knowledge sharing. As arts institutions evolve in the twenty-first century, this model of working together to maximize impact is already bearing results and redefining the meaning of scale."

Grusy stated, "It's a great honor to rejoin the New Museum at such a pivotal moment. I've long admired how this visionary institution has charted new territory at every level, from programming to partnerships.
